- a) *The Rime of the Ancient Mariner* recounts a story of crime and punishment. Is this an adequate assessment of Coleridge's poem?
- b) "Keats's reinvention of Classical Mythology served a purpose that was beyond the Romantic agenda, it looked at all humanity and explored the possibility of the sublime" Critically assess this statement with reference to the texts in your syllabus.
- c) Comment on Browning's treatment of the Italian Renaissance with reference to any two poems in your syllabus.
- 2. Answer any **one** of the following questions (250 words):

5x1=5

- a) Write a short note on the albatross in *The Rime of the Ancient Mariner*.
- b) Comment on the significance of the deification of Psyche as presented by Keats in 'Ode to Psyche'.
- c) A key element in Browning's monologues is the situation which facilitates the drama. Write briefly on the significance of the occasion in one such monologue included in your syllabus.

Unit II

- 3. Answer any **one** of the following questions (750 words): $15 \times 1 = 15$
- a) *Mansfield Park* relates that the social position of a person can change after his/her marriage. How far do you agree with the statement? Critically discuss.
- b) Critically comment on the spiritual transformation of Dombey in *Dombey and Son*.
- c) Tess of the d'Urbervilles is a powerful critique of dominant social mores. Discuss.
- 4. Answer any **one** of the following questions (250 words):

- a) Why was Mrs. Norris reprimanded by Senior Bertram at the end of the novel?
- b) Would you consider Mr. Carker the villain in *Dombey and Son?* Briefly justify your answer.
