1. Answer any one of the following: (750 words)

- a) Discuss with suitable examples how Said, in *Orientalism*, establishes the fact that ideological suppositions, images and fantasies in literary texts created the opposition between 'us' and 'them'.
- b) 'Colonial education in Africa only encouraged cerebral activity and dissociated the native from his own culture'. Critically comment on this statement using suitable examples from *Decolonizing the Mind*.
- c) Discuss with reference to *The Nation and its Fragments*, how for the nineteenth century Indian elite, a struggle for nationhood and an independent Indian historiography became equally important for resistance against colonial rule.
- 2. Answer any one of the following: (250 words)

- a) Write a short note on how Said uses the Foucauldian concepts of power and knowledge while framing his primary argument in *Orientalism*.
- b) Briefly discuss what Ngugi meant when he wrote "English was the official vehicle and the magic formula to colonial elitedom".
- c) Comment on the representation of the modern Bengali woman of the nineteenth century with reference to any text you have read.

3. Answer any one of the following: (250 words)

- a) "Raleigh wrote *The Discoverie of Guiana* about not discovering Guiana". How is the discovery of Guiana deferred in Raleigh's account of his expedition?
- b) Do you think that Kipling's *Kim* bears evidence of 'mumbo-jumbo', as Said put it? Give reasons for your answer.
- c) Discuss how in *Waiting for the Barbarians*, "the barbarian Other generally appears as a blank 'slip' on which the Empire engraves itself".
- 4. Answer any one of the following: (750 words)

- a) Comment on the significance of the cartographic details provided by Walter Raleigh in *The Discovery of Guiana*.
- b) Write a short note on the ambivalence in Colonel Creighton's depiction in Kim.
- c) With reference to the figure of Mandel, comment on Coetzee's representation of the figure of the torturer in *Waiting for the Barbarians*.
