- d) Would you agree that Gabriel's opening encounter with Lily in 'The Dead' anticipates his final exclusion from Gretta's devotions? Answer with suitable references to the text.
- e) Comment critically on the impact of the Colonel's demise on the two daughters in 'The Daughters of the Late Colonel' by Katherine Mansfield.

 f) What does Eliot mean by the 'historical sense' within European poetic tradition? Answer with reference to any two essays in your syllabus.
